Regional Queensland Scholarships

Are you looking to upskill, enhance or change your career? Expand your horizons with a Destination Australia scholarship.

In a joint collaboration with the Australian Government, Rural Medical Education Australia is offering a number of Destination Australia Program Scholarships. The program is open to domestic students to study in one of our regional campuses.

The Destination Australia Scholarships program aims to attract and support students to study in regional Australia, to grow and develop regional Australian tertiary education providers and offer students a high-quality learning experience.

Destination Australia applications for Semester 1, 2023 are open to full-time Certificate IV students enrolled at our Toowoomba, Kingaroy, Chinchilla or Warwick campus. Students will commence their studies in Semester 1, 2023 in our HLT43015 Certificate IV in Allied Health Assistance.

The scholarships are valued at up to \$15,000 per year for the 2 year duration of your program and paid in half yearly payments after Census Date. Students who can demonstrate either financial need, are first in family to study, those living with a disability and First Nation's peoples will be prioritised.

The money can be used to help cover the costs of studying, such as tuition fees, textbooks, or costs associated with placements or study-related travel.

This application is for domestic students only.

Eligibility

- Commencing full-time study in semester 1, 2023 at
- Maintain ongoing residency in a regional area* for the duration of the program
- enrolled in RuralMedEd HLT43015 Certificate IV in Allied Health Assistance
- the scholarship is not transferrable to another course and cannot be held concurrently with another scholarship.

Selection criteria

Applicants must submit the Destination Australia Scholarship Application Form, which must include the following:

- a personal statement demonstrating commitment to studying and supporting the regional community in which you will be studying;
- evidence of academic achievement or academic aspiration (examples may include transcripts, awards, referee reports and commendations); and
- other supporting documentation as evidence of your income and any equity considerations, if applicable.
